Q - In which community does your nonprofit operate?

85% of respondents operated in Ventura County (70%) or a combination of Ventura County/Santa Barbara County (15%)

- Q Does your organization provide direct relief to individuals and/or families?
- 38% of respondents provide direct relief to individuals or families
- Q What was the result of your organization's year-end fundraising efforts?

64% of respondents met (36%) or exceeded (28%) year-end fundraising goal

Q - What changes do you expect to make to your fundraising strategy in 2018? Please circle multiple answers if appropriate.

59% responded that they would be seeking to secure additional funds from individuals (32%) and grantors (27%)

18% responded that they planned to seek increased revenue from special events

Q - What does your organization need to help strengthen your development efforts in 2018?

- 30% Assistance drafting a targeted case for support that highlights needs
- 26% Assistance developing an individual donor campaign
- 21% Assistance with grant research or grant writing
- 11.5% assistance coordinating a network of service providers that can approach donors together

11.5% other:

- Augment staff with major gift officer
- Time to heal
- Help reaching funders outside of region (wildlife rescue organization with primary donors in Montecito)
- All volunteer organization is compromised by impact of fire on leadership
- Access to corporate community to make a case to support loans for housing
- Finding/creation of housing options
